The student council thanks you in advance for supporting this worthy cause.

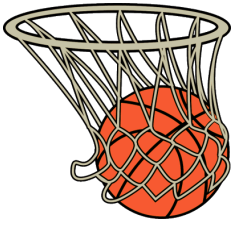


Christmas Program
